

# Choosing a Search Tool

There is a difference between the "free web"—that is, information that can be accessed through a search engine such as Google or AltaVista—and subscription databases that are accessible on the Internet but are "invisible" to typical search engines.

**The free web:** The Internet is a worldwide system of computer networks; when using search engines such as Google or AltaVista, you are actually searching the "free" parts of the Internet. Your searches will lead you to websites, and it is important to remember that *anyone* can create a website. Therefore, it is critical to evaluate a website's content for accuracy and reliability.

**Subscription databases:** The library provides access to many databases that are accessible through the Internet (in other words, you must have Internet access in order to use them), but the content is not found using normal search engines. These databases are therefore part of the "invisible" web. These databases are not free—in fact many are quite expensive—but students have access to them through the library (which has paid for such access). These databases contain published material, such as newspaper, magazine, and encyclopedia articles. Content has been checked for reliability and accuracy.

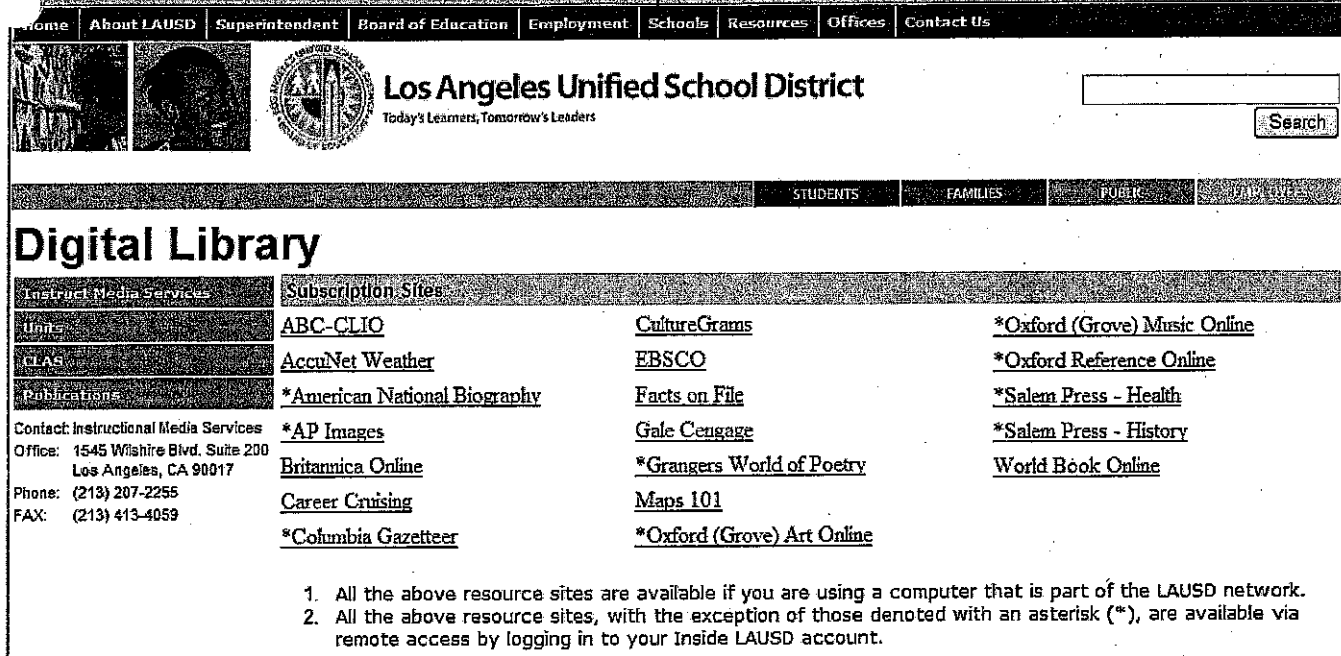
When should I use a search engine (for the free web) and when should I consult a subscription database (part of the "invisible web")?

Use a search engine when you:	Use databases when you want:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• want to go to a specific website</li><li>• have a narrow or unusual topic or have several keywords</li><li>• want to retrieve a large number of documents for your topic</li><li>• want government information and forms</li><li>• want to search for particular types of documents, file types, languages, etc.</li><li>• <i>are willing to evaluate the web site's content!</i></li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• newspaper articles</li><li>• magazine/journal articles</li><li>• encyclopedia articles</li><li>• biographical information</li><li>• published material that has gone through a review and editing process, ensuring a greater likelihood of accuracy and reliability</li></ul>
